**Please read carefully** as there is specific information pertaining to our 2021 version of the South Mountain Fair Jr. Home Crafts division, due to the Global Covid-19 pandemic. Due to these circumstances, we are offering a somewhat **abridged** version of entry selection for this year.

- Entry tags need to be obtained in advance from Anne Caza at 10622 Main St., South Mountain, 613-989-5348, Maddison Barkley via call/text: 613-803-4398, (or from Sandra Weagant, Anna Smail, & Anne MacDonald ) - **more locations for entry tag pick up may be posted later**-
- All entry tags **must** be filled out in advance and attached to exhibit when items are dropped off to be judged. If the tags are not filled out properly, or at all, the items will simply not be judged. See the example on how to fill out the entry tags properly on our Facebook page called *South Mountain Fair*. - Exhibit items are to be dropped off at the Mountain Township Agricultural Hall on Saturday, August 14<sup>th</sup> between 9:30 and 11:00 am. Volunteers will come to your vehicle to collect the exhibits; please have items securely place in a labeled box(es)/bin(s) to be left with us. (Please label boxes/bins with Family name). Once judged, items will be returned to the box(es).
- Judging will take place on Friday, August 20<sup>th</sup>.
- Exhibits are to be picked up on Sunday, August 22<sup>nd</sup> between 1:00 and 3:00 p.m.
- Prize money will be paid out by mailed cheque. Please be sure we have your mailing address when entering exhibits.
- **The Committee is not responsible for uncollected exhibits or prizes.**

## 10-Jr. Kindergarten & Sr. Kindergarten (Use grade exhibitor completed in June 2021).

K10-1. Using toilet paper or paper towel rolls create a set of binoculars. Show your imagination!

K10-2. Using any medium, draw a picture of “Me at the beach,” on a piece of paper.

K10-3. With popsicle sticks, create a snowflake; embellishments accepted.

K10-4. Using handprint(s) and/or footprint(s) create a lion - add-ons accepted.

K10-5. Using a toilet paper roll as the trunk, create an apple tree.

K10-6. Create a snail using disposable plate(s); other materials may be used!!!

## 20-Grades 1-3 (Use grade the exhibitor completed in June 2021).

20-1. Decorate a box (shoebox, or box similar in size) to create a treasure chest. Include what you would consider “treasure,” in your box.

20-2. Create a pizza, using craft material of your choice.

20-3. Decorate a tomato juice or apple juice can to look like a tiger.

20-4. Create a bird house using recycled materials.

20-5. Create a fox! Anything goes!!!

20-6. Be Bright!!! Create a light saber!

20-7. Catch the rays!!! Create a hanging sun catcher.

20-8. Using your favorite medium, draw & color your favorite story book character on a piece of paper. Name your character and identify the book.

## 30-Grades 4-6 (Use grade exhibitor completed in June 2021).

30-1. Create a bug using any size bottle/jar cap(s).

30-2. Make a paper airplane that is able to glide; can be decorated and embellished; (not from a kit).

30-3. Using Bristol board, cardstock, or canvas, create a piece of art using your first name initial.

30-4. Using a plastic bottle, create a monster –make it Spooktacular!

30-5. Create a “wanted” poster.

30-6. Using a mason jar, create a pencil holder decorated as an apple.

30-7. Make a bracelet using materials of your choice (i.e. paracord, beads, embroidery, thread, etc.)



30-8. On paper/cardstock of your choice, create Doodle Art. Submit your best doodling using pen, pencil, coloured pencil or marker. May be mounted.



30-9. Again, this year!! Highest score exhibitor in the Grades 4-6 division wins a bonus \$25 cash gift, courtesy of JED Express Ltd.

**40-Grades 7-8** (Use grade exhibitor completed in June 2021).

40-1. Create a piece of artwork using a variety of lines.

40-2. Create a fairy house using any medium.

40-3. Create a lantern using a tin can. Anything goes!

40-4. Using a shoebox or box similar in size, create a crime scene. Anything goes!

40-5. Decorate a T-shirt!

40-6. Your interpretation of "Christmas in a jar"!

40-7. Drawing of a mythical creature in medium(s) of your choice (i.e. lead pencil, pencil crayons, metallic gel pens, etc.)

40-8. Using permanent markers (i.e. Sharpies), decorate a mug for Father's Day.



40-9. Again, this year!! Highest score exhibitor in the Grades 7-8 division wins a bonus \$25 cash gift, courtesy of JED Express Ltd.

50-5. Create your favourite 3D animal using at least one recycled material. Other materials are welcome too!

50-6. A lead pencil drawing.

50-7. Using oil pastels or wax crayons and water colour create a piece of art.

50-8. Draw and colour your favorite movie character.

50-9. Design a tattoo on a ¼ piece of regular printer paper. May be mounted.

50-10. Create a heart—any medium!

50-11. Paint a rock!

50-12. Make a bottle cap(s) creation! Anything goes! (Mosaic type, 3-D, etc.)
