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## Rules and Regulations

Mountain Township Agricultural Society. P.O. Box 114, South Mountain, ON K0E 1W0

**Members- Please read all Rules and Regulations before making entries.**

**All Exhibitors must be members!**

**ABSOLUTELY NO ALCOHOL TO BE BROUGHT ONTO FAIRGROUNDS.**

**MTAS and OPP WILL STRICTLY ENFORCE THIS RULE.**

1. All animals and articles offered for competition must be bone fide, that is, the property of the Exhibitor.
2. No persons under the influence of alcohol will be permitted to exhibit or handle livestock, compete in the Demolition Derby, or participate in any activity that could cause harm or endanger anyone.
3. Any person exhibiting any animal or article in any section or class cannot compete with the same animal or article in any other section or class.
4. Any person may become a member of MTAS by paying the sum of \$10.00, if paid before the beginning of the show in which the person wishes to exhibit.
5. The judges have the right to withhold any or all prizes when animal or article is not worthy, even if there is no competition.
6. All articles shall be in the Lila Fawcett Exhibit Hall by 11:00 am. On Friday August 14<sup>th</sup>, 2009, and cannot be removed until 4:00pm Sunday August 16<sup>th</sup> 2009, without permission of the Fair office. The Board of Directors reserves the right to withhold the payment of prizes awarded if the articles are removed before the allotted time.
7. All persons showing purebred stock must produce a registered pedigree on making entry, and also at the hour of judging to the committee chairperson and judges.
8. All appeals against the award of the judges shall be handed in writing to the Secretary within seven (7) days of the fair.
9. The superintendent of the horse ring will hear protests from the Exhibitors immediately after prizes are awarded and submit them to the Director's meeting called within 15 days of the fair.
10. The admission fee to the MTAS grounds shall be posted the days of the fair.
11. Any person, except the judges and the committee chairpersons, handling any article in the Exhibit Hall will be asked to leave the hall while judging occurs.
12. Members winning \$10.00 or more in prize money shall leave the sum of \$10.00 with the Secretary for membership for the next year.
13. Any junior exhibitor reaching the age of 17 years on or before the date of the fair must pay a \$10.00 membership fee. Proof of age must be shown upon request.
14. Any member of the Society, who is heard to censure or accuse any judge of partiality in any way in which his/her decision may have been given, or in any manner relating to his/her respective duties, shall for the first offense be fined \$25.00. For the second offense shall be expelled from the Society. Two credible witnesses will be sufficient to convict. The Board of Directors reserves the right to withhold the payment of prizes awarded, or to expel an exhibitor from the Society.
15. No loitering on the fair grounds. Anyone found loitering will be removed from the grounds.
16. All vehicles must be parked in the designated areas.
17. Exhibitors are requested to send their entry forms and entry fees (if applicable) as soon as possible after the receipt of the prize lists, at least one week prior to the Fair.
18. Each exhibitor, member, or visitor, shall be responsible for any injury that may be occasioned to any person whosoever by any animal exhibited, used or owned by him/her or them, and each exhibitor, member or visitor shall indemnify the Society against all claims or demands of any person in charge of the same, and upon these conditions are entries allowed on the grounds.
19. While the Directors will take every possible precaution to ensure the safety of articles entered in the exhibition, the owners themselves must take the risk of exhibiting, and should any article be accidentally destroyed, injured, lost or stolen, the Directors will render all assistance in their power towards recovery but will not make payment of the value thereof.
20. Exhibitors of livestock must show their own liability insurance in order to exhibit.

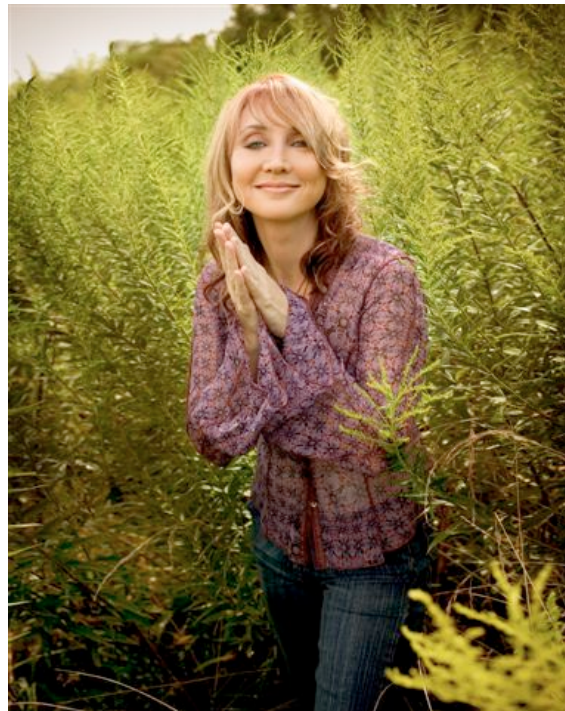

**In the interest of Safety , anyone entering is subject to, and must obey, the following rules and regulations.**

## **Rules & Regulations**

Each Driver must fill out an entry form.



Each driver must supply their own car  
MTAS reserves the right to approve or reject any or all entries  
No cars are permitted in the competition area before the heat in which they are to participate.

### **Type of Car**

Any Stock, hardtop automobile or station wagon is allowed  
Any stock factory made rear ends are permitted, including posi-traction and limited slip differentials.  
No Trucks, jeeps, convertibles, hearses, limousines are allowed

### **Preparation of Car**

Remove the following before arriving at the track: All glass, including windshield, side windows, head and tail lights (rolling down window is not permitted). Chrome molding strips & Bottom portion of rear seat must be removed by mashing down or cutting off.

No special bumpers, reinforcement, fabrications, or trailer hitches permitted.

Welded solid or chained-down engine mounts are recommended

Roll over Bars are allowed but not necessary.

All doors must be fastened **shut** by wire (minimum four strands), straps or welded, for the driver's safety.

No spring jacks, blocked shocks or reversed shackles are permitted.

Suspension must be free of blocks. No Helper springs or altered suspension are allowed. Torsion bars should be at manufacturer's specifications, etc.

Only one automotive-type battery is allowed. It may be removed to any location in the car, but must be securely fastened and covered.

Cutting fenders for wheel clearance only is permissible – ends of bumpers may be cut off.

Hood must be fastened down in four (4) places; trunk or tailgate must be fastened down in four (4) places. Official's decision on overuse of wire.

Stock gas tanks must be moved from stock position into the trunk or rear seat area. A small portable tank is recommended in place of the original. All tanks must be securely fastened and covered. A Maximum of four (4) gallons of gas is permitted per heat.

Auto must be swept clean. No Junk tires, wheels, metal parts, glass, etc., is allowed in the car.

It is recommended that the driver's door be reinforced inside with steel bar, angle iron or pipe. Length not to extend more than eight (8) inches on either end of the driver's door.

It is recommended that a minimum sixteen (16) inch opening be cut in the center of the hood cover over the carburetor (in case of fire).

Only automotive type tires, no double tires permitted. No studs or screws in rims to hold tires.

A strong wire or nylon mesh screen is recommended on the driver's window and windshield area. Scatter shields are also recommended.

### **Running**

A safety belt, Z-90, approved helmet and approved goggles for eye protection are required.

One-piece overalls or garment with long sleeves and pant legs are mandatory. **NO SHORTS** are permitted.

Drivers may maneuver forward and backward but there will be no deliberate hitting on the driver's door. Any driver not obeying this rule will automatically be disqualified.

Vehicles have dependable and sufficient brakes at all times and competition area boundaries must be observed at all times.

**NO DRINKING OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ON TRACK, EMERGENCY VEHICLE AREA, PIT AREA OR GENERAL AREA OF DERBY IS ALLOWED. ANY DRIVER OR PIT MAN UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOL OR DRUGS WILL BE IMMEDIATELY DISQUALIFIED AND REMOVED FROM THE GROUNDS.**

**A vehicle will be disqualified if the driver's door comes open during a heat.**

Two minutes time limit is enforced by the officials for restarts and making competitive contact with another car. Hits must be aggressive. Simple contact within the time limit does not constitute combat and could be considered sandbagging.

All decisions made by OFFICIALS are final.

All heat winners will be allowed to work on their cars 20 minutes before the final heat.

**ALL CARS ARE TO BE REMOVED FROM THE M.T.A.S GROUNDS FOLLOWING THE SHOW OR THEY WILL BECOME THE PROPERTY OF M.T.A.S AND OFFICIALS WILL HAVE THEM REMOVED.**

**TITLES MUST BE TURNED IN ON ALL CARS LEFT FOR JUNK.**

## Country Fair 2009 Rules

All classes are open competition to all exhibitors, including Juniors, except those marked with Age Restrictions. Only one entry is allowed per category. Exhibits must be in the Hall no later than 11:30 am on Friday, August 14, 2009 and remain until Sunday August 16, 2009 at 4:00 pm.

Pie entries will consist of a generous piece of pie except where listed. Please bring a small plate and plastic bag to leave one piece for the show when a whole entry is required.

**Note** that entries are not refrigerated. Chairperson is not responsible for goods after 4:00 pm, Sunday, August 16. All entries must include a completed and folded tag and be displayed on paper or plastic plates in plastic bags or see through covering. Tags may be obtained from the Chairperson or members of the fairboard before the fair. All entry tags will be opened after the judging. Winners of **Special prizes** will have their photos submitted to the sponsoring company. Junior and Adult prize money will be mailed out after the fair.

### Please Follow these Rules for Country Fair Classes (CF 1-8):

1. All contestants must submit entries that were made using the sponsor's product.
2. A product label must accompany each entry as proof of purchase.
3. All entries will be judged on appearance, taste, texture and creativity of recipe and presentation. Decision of the judge(s) will be final.
4. Entrant's name and address must be submitted with each entry.
5. **All first place winners must submit recipe, proof of purchase, photograph and signed release form giving permission to the sponsors for use of the winner's name, recipe and/or photograph in any other advertising or publicity without payment.**

### Betty's Special –Daddy's Tea Biscuits

2 cups All purpose flour

4 tsp baking powder

1 tbsp sugar

½ tsp salt

½ cup cold butter or shortening

1 egg

Mix flour, baking powder, sugar and salt. Cut in butter or shortening. Mix egg and milk, then add to flour mixture.

Stir with fork to make soft dough. Turn out on floured board. Knead 8-10 times. Roll about ¾" thick. Cut out with about 2" cutter.

Bake at 425 degrees F for 10 to 12 minutes.

### Mud Cookies

½ cup milk

½ cup margarine

6 tbsp cocoa

2 cups white sugar

3 cups rolled oats

1 cup coconut

Bring milk, margarine, cocoa and sugar to a boil in frying pan, stirring constantly. When boiling, remove from heat and add rolled oats and the coconut. Blend and drop by spoonful on waxed paper.

### Butterscotch Confetti Squares

Margarine or butter ¼ cup

Peanut butter ½ cup

Butterscotch chips 1 cup

Small coloured marshmallows 8oz. bag

Melt butter or margarine and peanut butter in a large saucepan over low heat. Stir in chips until melted. Stir to prevent burning. Cool until you can hold your hand on the bottom of the pan. **Get your Mom to do this.** Add marshmallows and stir until all are coated. Pack down in a 9x9 inch pan that you have lined with wax paper. Refrigerate. Then cut into squares

### Sticky Buns

1 envelope active dry yeast

2 tbsp Lukewarm water (105-115 degrees F)

½ cup Lukewarm fat-free (skim) milk (105-115 degrees F)

1 Egg

2 tsp Unsalted butter, melted

2 ½ cups All-purpose flour

3 tbsp Granulated sugar

1 ½ tsp Cinnamon

½ tsp Salt

½ cup Dark raisins  
2 tsp Fat-free milk  
¼ cup Confectioner's sugar  
½ tsp Vanilla extract

In a small bowl, sprinkle the yeast over the water. Let stand until foamy, about 10 minutes.

In a small bowl, combine the lukewarm milk, egg and butter. In a food processor, combine the flour, granulated sugar, cinnamon and salt. With the machine running, scrape the yeast mixture and milk mixture through the feed tube until the dough forms a ball. Knead the dough by pulsing until it is smooth and no longer sticky, about 30 times.

Spray a large bowl with non-stick cooking spray; place the dough in the bowl. Cover loosely with plastic wrap or a damp towel and let the dough rise in a warm, draft-free place until it double in volume, 30-45 minutes.

Spray an 8" cake pan with non-stick cooking spray. Punch down the dough. Lightly sprinkle a work surface with flour. Turn out the dough. Knead in the raisins and divide the dough into 8 pieces. Roll each piece of dough into an 8" rope, then coil the ropes into buns. Place the buns in the pan. Cover loosely with plastic wrap or a damp towel and let them rise until doubled in volume, 35-40 minutes.

Preheat the oven to 375 degrees F. Brush the tops of the buns with the milk. Bake on the centre oven rack until lightly browned, 20-25 minutes.

Meanwhile, in a small bowl, combine the confectioner's sugar, vanilla and 1 ½ teaspoons warm water. Spread over the buns as soon as you remove them from the oven.

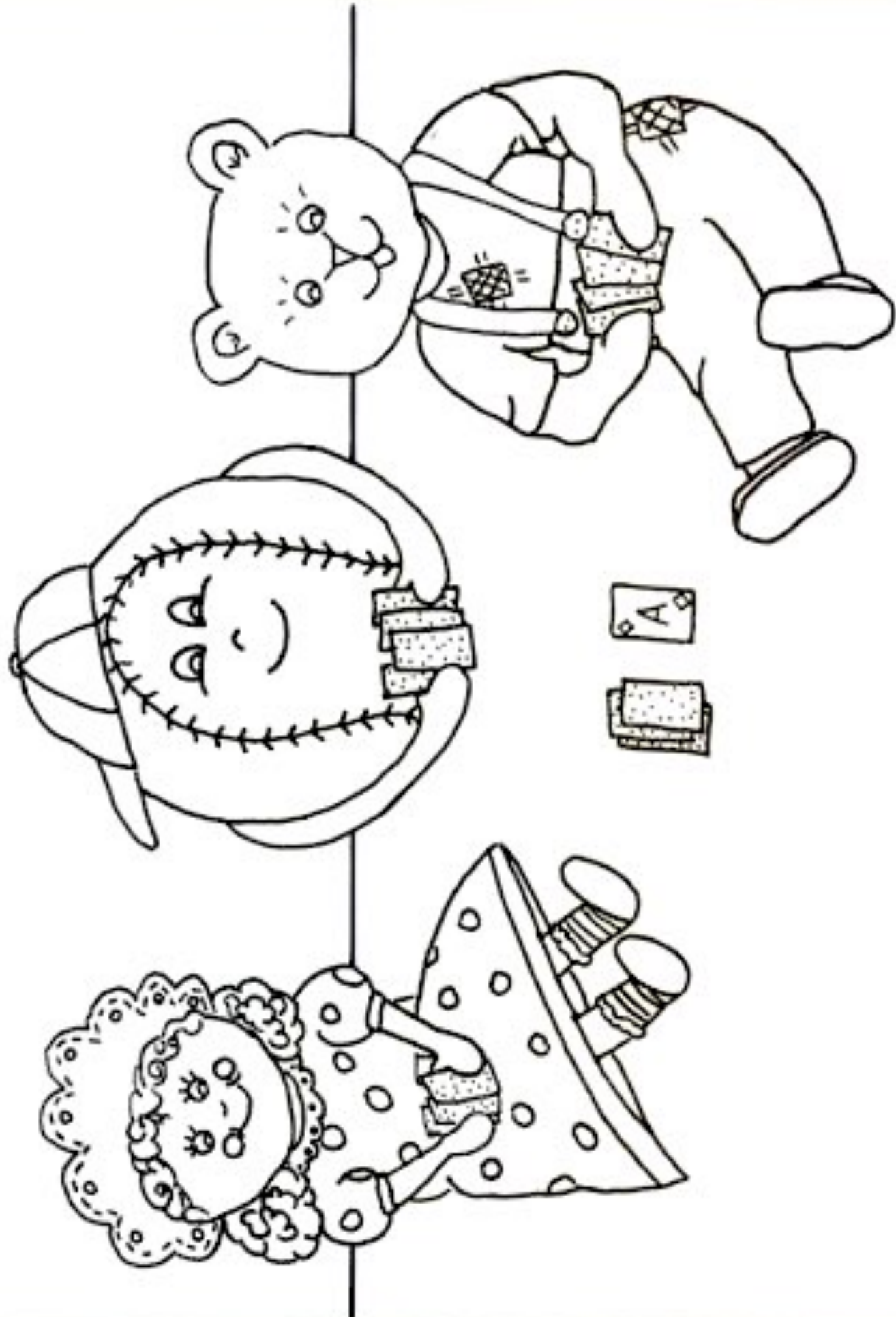

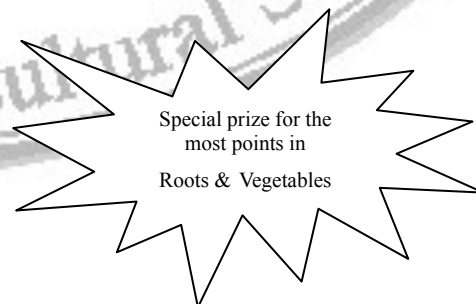

OELTRA has adopted a Code of Conduct for its members, crew personnel, officials and any other persons involved with a sanctioned OELTRA event. All of the rules should be read thoroughly, as they will be enforced at all events and subject to technical inspection and at the discretion of the chief Tech Steward or Race Director. When in doubt ask for a ruling in advance to ensure that you are not disqualified during an event.

OELTRA reserves the right to make changes to the rules for safety and for the benefit and growth of lawnmower racing.

The final decision in any OELTRA business lies with the Executive. This includes race event locations, membership, rules, specs and Code of Conduct. The decision as to tractor eligibility rests with the Tech Steward.

Any questions, suggestions or concerns should be forwarded to the executive or the local representative in your area.

### **CODE OF: Good Sportsmanship, Common Sense and Fair Competition/Keep it simple.**

1. No drugs or alcohol shall be consumed during any race event. Doing so will result in immediate disqualification from that event. Continued infractions could result in being ejected from any further race events or annulment of membership.
2. Profanity or insulting behavior at race events will not be tolerated.
3. Each racer is responsible for the actions of his/her guests and crew while at the race event. This includes while you are on the track.
4. Tractors must remain at minimum speed when in pit area and grid area.
5. All race participants must register no later than 1/2 hour prior to drivers meeting, at which time registration will be closed.
6. It is the responsibility of each race participant to recognize the flag rules.

### **PERSONAL SAFETY EQUIPMENT**

The following gear must be worn at all times when operating the racer: Gloves, CSA/DOT approved helmet with visor or goggles, long pants, boots which cover ankles, long sleeved shirt or jacket and attached tethered kill switch (see basic rules).

2. Must be seated on seat of bike
3. No blocking of suspensions or water filled tires  
(bikes will be checked before event any bikes that do not pass inspection will be put in modified class)
4. No weights  
(exception-2 wheel drives allowed weight on front for pull only up to 100lbs)
5. Hitch at manufactures height
6. No passengers
7. Valid drivers license and proof of insurance is mandatory

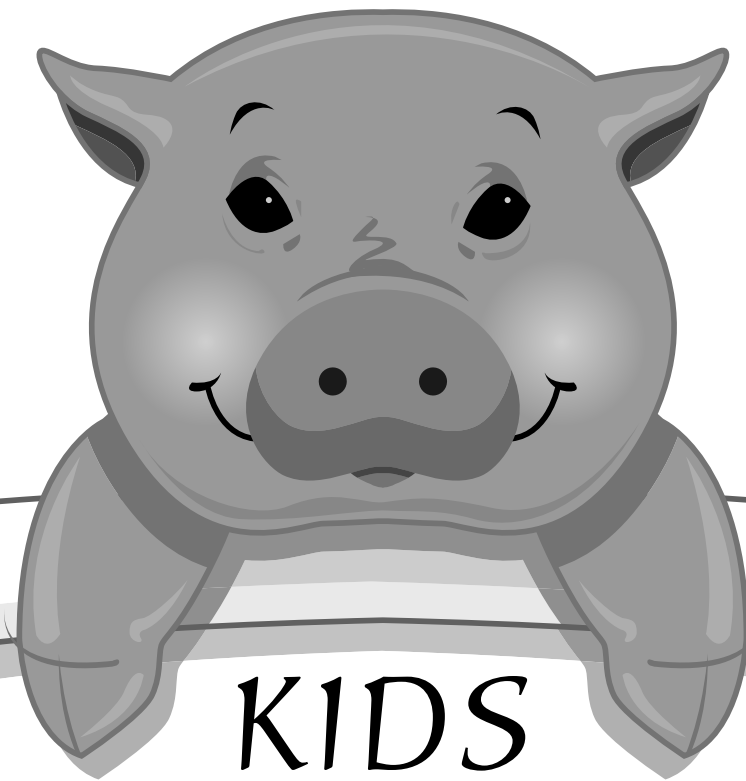
