Culinary Arts 2024 Rules

All first-time exhibitors are exempt from the MTAS membership fee but all other entrants must pay. All classes are open competition to all exhibitors, including juniors, except those marked with age restrictions. Juniors may enter in the adult section. Only one entry is allowed per category.

Exhibits must be in the Exhibit Hall no later than 11:30 am on Friday, August 16, 2024 and are to be picked up at 4:00 p.m. (NOT BEFORE) Sunday August 18, 2024. Chairperson is not responsible for goods after 5:00 p.m. on Sunday, August 18, 2024.

All pie entries are a generous piece of pie except where listed. Note that entries are not refrigerated. All entries must include a completed and folded entry tag and be displayed on paper or plastic plate in plastic bags or see-through covering.

All culinary entries must be registered using the Assist Expo link that will be available on the www.southmountainfair.ca website closer to fair time. Late entries (without registration on Assist Expo) are allowed and will be registered Friday when brought to the Exhibit Hall.

Exhibit tags can be picked up from Sandra Weagant 613-989-2823 or call Fair office (613-989-2815) during the week of the fair.

2. Competition is open to youth up to age 15 years (as of December 31 of current year) of member societies of the OAAS.

3. Number of cookies to be shown at local fair/exhibition to be determined by each individual fair/exhibition.

District Competition

- 1. District entry must consist of 6 cookies displayed on a clean, sturdy plate (no paper plates) inside of a clear plastic bag with the exhibitor's name, mailing address and fair represented.
- 2. Plain chocolate chip cookies, with no nuts, must be no larger than 2.5" (6.5 cm) and no smaller than 2" (5 cm).
- 3. If the exhibitor has won at more than one fair, the one closest to the exhibitor's home address is the agricultural society from which the entry will be sent to the district competition. The other agricultural societies may send their second place winner into the district competition. An exhibitor may only enter into one district competition.

Provincial Competition

- 4. The entry for the district must consist of 6 cookies displayed on a clean, sturdy plate (no paper plates) inside of a clear plastic bag with the exhibitor's name, mailing address and district represented.
- 5. Plain chocolate chip cookies, with no nuts are to be no larger than 2.5" (6.5 cm) and no smaller than 2" (5 cm).

3 Tea biscuits on a plate **Daddy's Tea Biscuits**

2 cups Flour

4 teaspoons Baking powder

1 tablespoon Sugar

½ teaspoon Salt

½ cup Butter

- 1 Egg + Enough milk to make 1 cup of liquid (approx. ¾ cup milk)
- 1. Crack egg into a 1 cup measure and add enough milk to fill cup.
- 2. In a separate bowl, mix flour, baking powder, salt and sugar
- 3. Cut butter into flour until crumbly
- 4. Add egg mixture to dry ingredients to make a soft dough. Knead lightly.
- 5. Roll out and cut into 2 ½ to 3 inch rounds.
- 6. Bake at 425 F for 10 to 12 minutes.
