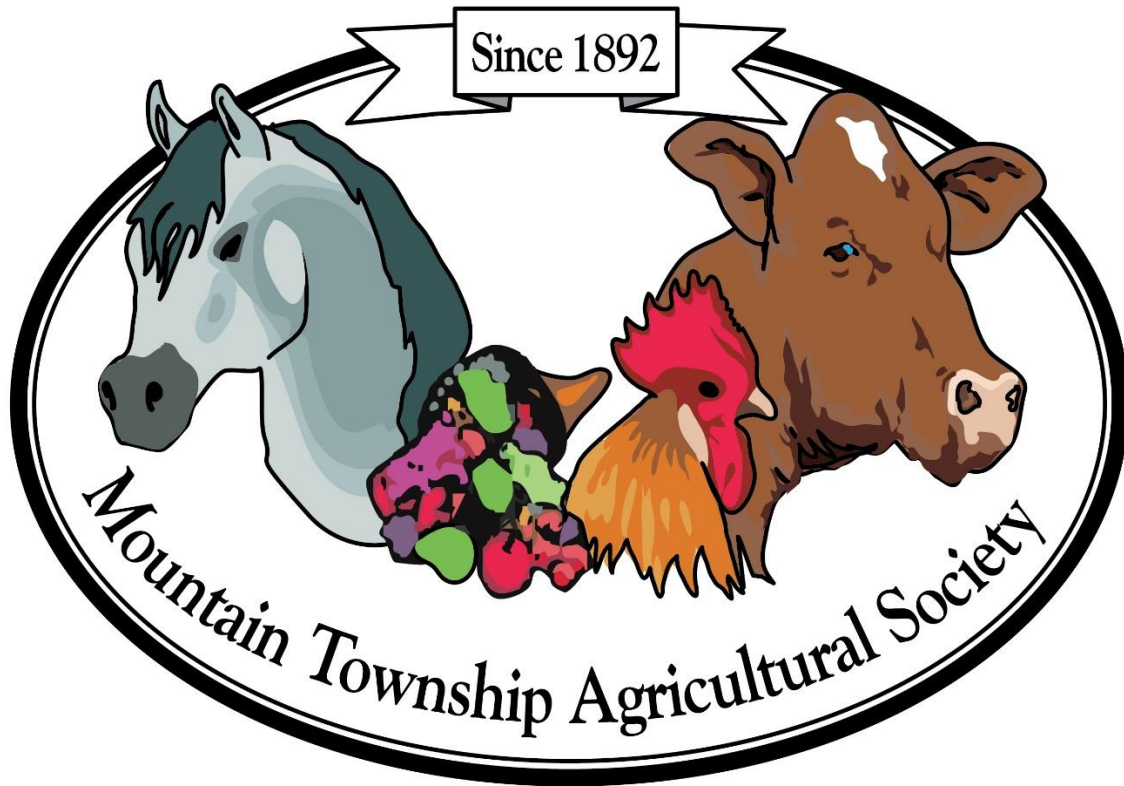

**Members- Please read all Rules and Regulations before making entries.**

**All Exhibitors must be members!**

**ABSOLUTELY NO ALCOHOL TO BE BROUGHT ONTO FAIRGROUNDS.**

**MTAS and OPP WILL STRICTLY ENFORCE THIS RULE.**

1. Any person may become a member of MTAS by paying the sum of \$10.00, if paid before the beginning of the show in which the person wishes to exhibit. Membership fees are waived for first time adult exhibitors and junior exhibitors.
2. Members winning \$10.00 or more in prize money shall leave the sum of \$10.00 with the Secretary for membership for the next year.
3. Any junior exhibitor reaching the age of 18 years on or before the date of the fair must pay a \$10.00 membership fee. Proof of age must be shown upon request.
4. The admission fee to the MTAS grounds shall be posted the days of the fair.
5. All animals and articles offered for competition must be bone fide, that is, the property of the Exhibitor.
6. Any person exhibiting any animal or article in any section or class cannot compete with the same animal or article in any other section or class.
7. All persons showing purebred stock must produce a registered pedigree on making entry, and also at the hour of judging to the committee chairperson and judges.
8. The superintendent of the horse ring will hear protests from the Exhibitors immediately after prizes are awarded and submit them to the Director's meeting called within 15 days of the fair.
9. All articles shall be in the Lila Fawcett Exhibit Hall by 11:30 am, on Friday August 16, 2019 and cannot be removed until 4:00 pm Sunday, August 18, 2019 without permission of the Fair office. The Board of Directors reserves the right to withhold the payment of prizes awarded if the articles are removed before the allotted time.
10. The judges have the right to withhold any or all prizes when animal or article is not worthy, even if there is no competition.
11. All appeals against the award of the judges shall be handed in writing to the Secretary within seven (7) days of the fair.
12. No persons under the influence of alcohol will be permitted to exhibit or handle livestock, compete in the Demolition Derby, the Truck or Tractor Pulls or participate in any activity that could cause harm or endanger anyone.
13. Any person, except the judges and the committee chairpersons, handling any article in the Exhibit Hall will be asked to leave the hall while judging occurs.
14. Any member of the Society, who is heard to censure or accuse any judge of partiality in any way in which his/her decision may have been given, or in any manner relating to his/her respective duties, shall for the first offense be fined \$25.00. For the second offense shall be expelled from the Society. Two credible witnesses will be sufficient to convict. The Board of Directors reserves the right to withhold the payment of prizes awarded, or to expel an exhibitor from the Society.
15. No loitering on the fairgrounds. Anyone found loitering will be removed from the grounds.
16. All vehicles must be parked in the designated areas.
17. Exhibitors are requested to send their entry forms and entry fees (if applicable) as soon as possible after the receipt of the prize lists, at least one week prior to the Fair.
18. Each exhibitor, member, or visitor, shall be responsible for any injury that may be occasioned to any person whatsoever by any animal exhibited, used or owned by him/her or them, and each exhibitor, member or visitor shall indemnify the Society against all claims or demands of any person in charge of the same, and upon these conditions are entries allowed on the grounds.
19. While the Directors will take every possible precaution to ensure the safety of articles entered in the exhibition, the owners themselves must take the risk of exhibiting, and should any article be accidentally destroyed, injured, lost or stolen, the Directors will render all assistance in their power towards recovery but will not make payment of the value thereof.
20. **Livestock Passes** will be allotted as follows; for every 1-2 animals exhibited you will receive – 1 Pass, 3-4 animals exhibited - 2 Passes, 5-6 animals exhibited - 3 Passes, 7-8 animals exhibited – 4 Passes, etc.
21. **Exhibitors of livestock must show their own liability insurance in order to exhibit.**
22. **Under no circumstances should an animal exhibiting signs of transmittable disease be taken to the South Mountain Fair. The show committee and other Fair officials have the right to refuse entry of any animal showing signs of an infectious skin disease (e.g. warts, ringworm). If a vet check is required, it will be at the expense of the exhibitor.**
23. **Service dogs only permitted on fairgrounds during the fair.**

## 2024 Field Crop Competition (Section # 50)

### Hay, Corn, Soybeans, Fall Wheat, Spring Wheat

**A) - Hay Competition:** Two flakes of hay, four inches thick, from the competitors' field that was judged, to be entered and exhibited at the fair.

**B) – Corn Competition:** Six Stalks of Corn from the competitors' field that was judged, to be entered and exhibited at the fair.

**C) – Soybean Competition:** Field judging to be conducted during the month of August. Six Soybean plants (**roots intact**) will be entered and exhibited at the fair.

**D) – Fall Wheat Competition:** Field judging to be done in late July or early August. Ten pounds of grain taken from the field that was judged will be entered and exhibited at the fair. (Grain sample to be taken from current season (2024 harvest) crop, or 2023 crop if the current season crop is not yet harvested.)

**E) - Spring Wheat Competition:** Field judging to be done in late July or early August. Ten pounds of grain taken from the field that was judged will be entered and exhibited at the fair. (Grain sample to be taken from current season (2024 harvest) crop, or 2023 crop if the current season crop is not yet harvested.)

### Rules

1. Each of the above listed classes must have at least 3 entries and 3 fields scored by the judge.
2. A competitor may enter all of the above listed classes but will be confined to one entry in each crop type. Two or more persons working within a farm partnership may each make one entry in each of the above listed classes.
3. Entries are limited to members who have paid their annual membership to the M.T.A.S or membership fees will be deducted from prize monies.
4. Fields must be at least five (5) acres in sized to qualify for field judging.

5. Field crops are to be scored on the following criteria: General appearance, uniformity of crop, yield potential, freedom from insect feeding, and fungus diseases.
6. Entries for hay competition to be in the hands of Dean Williams (Chairperson) prior to the fair. Hay judging may be done while judging the other field crops.
7. The Chairperson will keep in close touch with the competitor(s) and the competitors are to notify the Chairperson at least four (4) days prior to harvesting any crop that is likely to be judged. This will give the Chairperson time to notify the judge to view the fields.
8. Samples to be dropped off at the exhibit hall at the M.T.A.S. fairgrounds Lila Fawcett Building between 8:30 AM and 11:30 AM on Friday August 16<sup>th</sup>, 2023. Exhibitor tags & bags will be available at the exhibit hall or by contacting the Chairperson in advance of the fair.

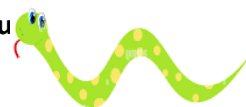

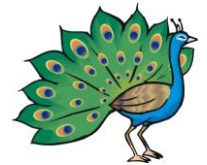

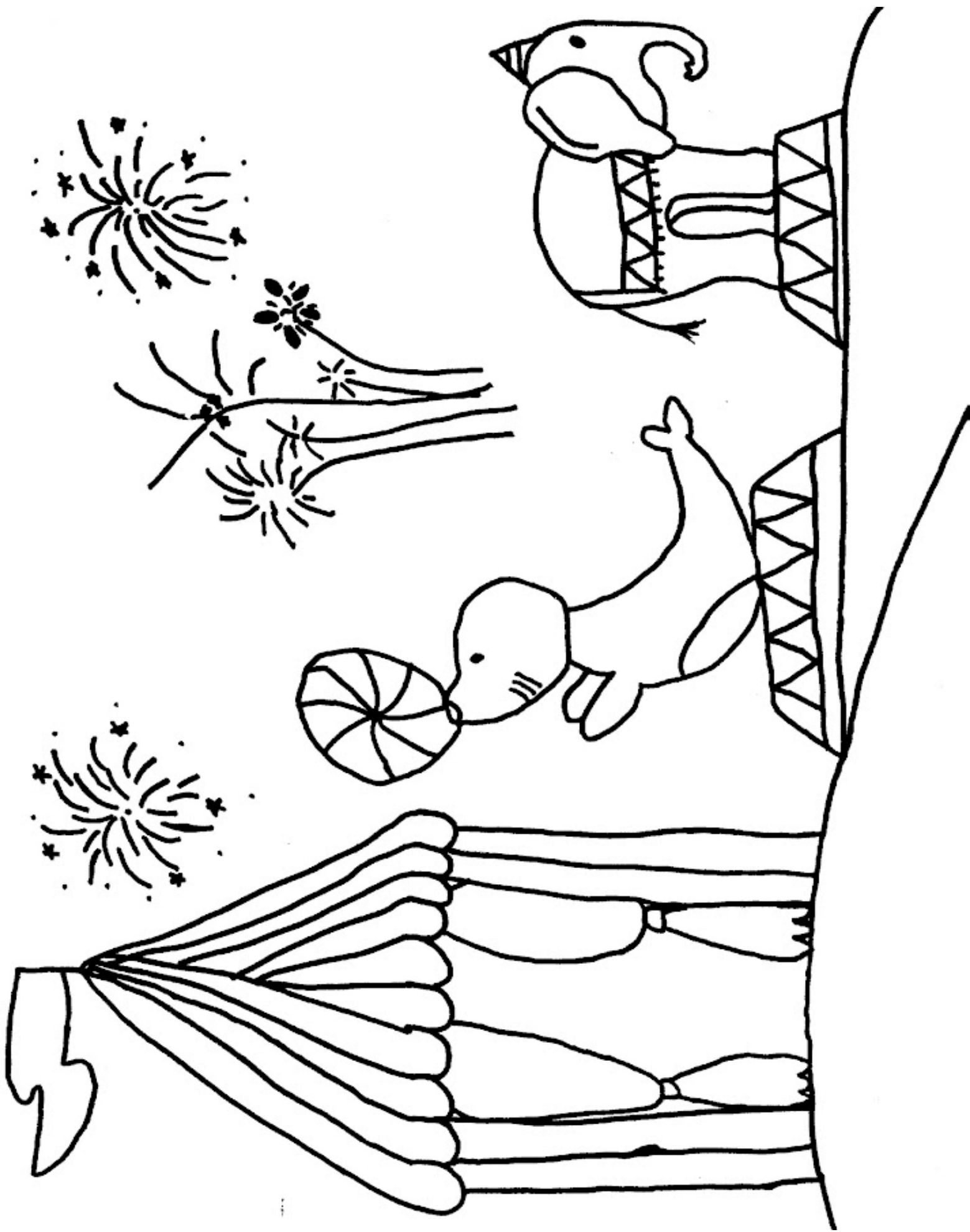

Entries should be made online using the Assist Expo link which will be available on the [www.southmountainfair.ca](http://www.southmountainfair.ca) website closer to fair time. Deadline for online entries is midnight Thursday August 15, 2024.

Any mailed in entries (using horse show entry form) must be received by August 5<sup>th</sup> at Mountain Township Agricultural Society, P.O. Box 114, South Mountain, ON K0E 1W0. Payment should accompany mailed in entries.

Entries received the day of the show will be charged a \$50 late fee and acceptance is not guaranteed depending on the number of current registrants.

Registrants completing online registration must bring a cheque (payable to MTAS) or cash to pay registration fees prior to the start of the show.

Entries must be filled out completely including all classes and divisions entered. Exhibitors are responsible for their own errors and those of their agents in preparation of their entry forms.

### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

1. Management, the Committee, and/or South Mountain Agricultural Fairgrounds will not be responsible for any accident which may occur to any exhibitor, owner, attendant, horse or equipment at the show.
2. ASTM/SEI approved helmets must be worn (and correctly fastened at all times) while mounted on the show grounds. Harness is required when jumping for all competitors.
3. Exhibitors are required to show in the following attire: jeans (blue/black) or breeches (beige/black), t-shirt (barn logo/blank), boots (with ½" heel, black), half chaps (if desired, black), ASTM helmet (black).
4. Please use designated parking areas. You will be asked to move your vehicle if it is parked in the No Parking areas.
5. HORSE TACK – in all classes, either English or Western tack is permitted. Snaffle bits are strongly recommended. No twisted wire bits, no gags, and no shanks longer than 2.5".
6. DEFINITION OF BEGINNER RIDER: These classes and divisions are created to be open and accessible for all riders who have control of their horse in the given gait division. Riders are to be in their first season of showing and in the first three years of riding.
7. First time adult exhibitors and junior exhibitors (under 18 years) are not required to pay the \$10 MTAS membership fee.
8. Only service dogs are permitted on the fairgrounds during the fair.
9. Livestock Passes will be allocated as follows: 1 -2 animals 1 pass, 3 – 4 animals 2 passes, etc.

### **CLASS CONDUCT**

1. Three entries unless otherwise noted are required to be a complete class. Management reserves the right to cancel any class if the required entries have not been received, and to combine any division, if necessary, to change an obstacle or alter any course. Division classes will be split for any class over 20 entries.
2. NO person will be allowed in the ring at any time unless invited in by the management.

3. Three ribbons will be awarded in all classes, unless otherwise stated.
4. In all divisions except for the Fun Division, points are award as such: 1<sup>st</sup> = 5pts, 2<sup>nd</sup>= 3pts, 3<sup>rd</sup> = 1pt
5. Champion ribbons will be awarded in all Lead line/Assisted, Walk, Trot, Canter and the Adult Division; the top five point earning riders in each division will be invited to ride in the championship class.
6. No cross entry into other gait-based divisions, with the exception of a rider entering a young horse in their first season, these riders will be issued a separate number (for the horse). Horse entries cannot enter a division, but may enter individual classes, and may have different riders.
7. Riders in the gait-based divisions wanting to enter the Games division, are able to – with the gait limitations in place. (i.e. – if you have a trot division rider, they will be limited to the trot during the Games Division)

#### SCHOOLING

Schooling in the main ring may be available on Friday – check with the chairperson. Schooling in the main arena will be available on Saturday during pauses in the Show (prior to start in AM, Lunch break, PM break, Dinner break) – check the main board.

All riders must listen to ring stewards regarding safety, all riders must be wearing a helmet.

#### STABLING

Hay and shavings are NOT available for purchase. There is a very limited number of stalls, competitors are welcomed to tie horses to their trailers or use their own portable corrals adjacent to their trailers. Competitors are encouraged to bring their own portable stall panels – as there are very limited stalls.

#### AWARDS & PRIZE MONEY

Three ribbons, unless otherwise stated, will be presented in all classes. Champion will be awarded in all divisions containing three or more classes with three or more competitors that run to completion. Prize money is indicated for each class. Prize money won can be paid by cheque or deducted from each participant's account. Prize money will be payable to the owner unless written authorization, and complete. Three entries, unless otherwise stated, are necessary to fill a class, or the class may be canceled.

26. In-Hand Costume

Up to participants per horse. Winner will be chosen by judges in the following categories:

- a. Most Original Design
- b. Raging 40's
- c. Cartoon Craze

All costumes must be constructed in a safe manner, any costume deemed by the judges to be unsafe will be excused by the judge. There are no riders in this division, horses must be led or ground driven.

27. In-Hand Turn Out Class

The cleanliness and correctness of the grooming, saddling and dress of rider is judged. Participants will be asked to lead in-hand their mount.

28. In-Hand Trail Class

Handlers will lead their horses through the obstacle course, according to posted pattern. Judges will be looking for an engaged forward walk, correct halts and eagerness of horse to complete obstacles.

29. Hobby Horse

This is a non-horse class. Participants must create their own hobby horse, at home, and come prepared to enter an undisclosed class format (either jumping, obstacles, equitation or dressage)

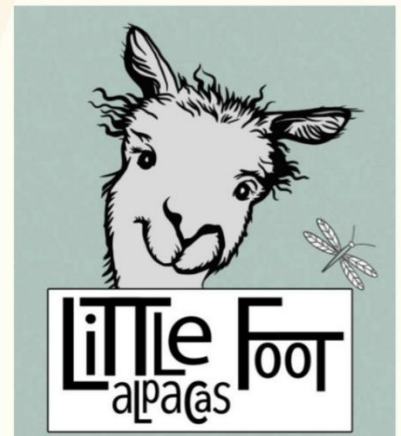
